


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kb vs 114 mb A: lspci lists PCI devices, not USB devices, so it should not show you USB devices unless you have some special USB controller on your motherboard, and it is not a PCI controller. The difference is that a USB controller can use PCI to the DMA subsystem. This is not possible for a PCI card. It may also help if you have different partitions for /home and /root. I would recommend adding a user and testing the differences. Also, create an SSH server on your box (and point it to your router) and use it to change your passwords. Q: How can I find out which branch a remote git branch points to? I'm working with two branches on a feature branch of an open source project, where I want to add a feature to the code. Is there any way I can find out which branch it's in? Like a command like git branch name, or something? I've already found this but it's not exactly what I need: You can try the following: git branch -r --contains path/to/file where path/to/file is the path of the file that you want to track.
